Theological Foundation

Time and Rhythm as Gifts from God

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- "Why can't I have it NOW?"
- "I hate aging!"
- "There's not enough time!"



•Fill the Creation

- Life bears life
- Spread the garden from Eden

Mark the Patterns

• Sun, moon, stars

Rest on the Sabbath

- Enjoy the progression
- Remember God is on the throne



- Humans: Sleep and Rest Needed
 - 1/3 of the day gone (56/168 hrs)
 - 1/7 of the week in sabbath (72/168 hrs)
 - Circadian rhythm
 - We still have to prep meals
 - We're not great at multitasking

God, Time, and Rhythm

- Efficient productivity not highest goal
- Time is a context for relationship
- Cares about our internal experience, not just external achievement



- Weekly Celebration (Sabbath)
- Annual Celebrations
- Seven Year Celebrations
- Fifty Year Celebrations

God's Rhythm for Israel

- Annual Celebrations (Lev.23)
 - Passover (month 1, day 14)
 - Unleavened Bread (week of Passover)
 - First Fruits (Sunday after Passover)
 - Pentecost (50 days after First Fruits; giving of the law at Sinai)
 - Trumpets (month 7, day 1)
 - Yom Kippur (month 7, day 10; Lev.16)
 - Booths (month 7, days 15 22)



Seven Year Celebrations

- Release from debt (Dt.15)
- Rest for the land (Lev.25:1 7)



•Fifty Year Celebration

- Jubilee Year (Lev.25:8 55)
- Land returned to families
- People returned to land
- Garden of Eden motif



- Observant of the Jewish calendar
- "My hour has not yet come" / "My hour has come"
- (Jn.2:4; 5:30; 8:20; 12:23; 13:1; 17:1)
- Crucified on Passover
 - Deepens the meaning of deliverance
- Resurrected on First Fruits
 - Deepens the meaning of new life



•Pentecost: Planned or Spontaneous? (Acts 2)

- Commemorates the giving of the Law at Sinai
- God appeared in fire on the mountain
- Tongues of fire on each disciple

God Speaks His Plans

•To Himself: 'Let there be light'; and there was light (Gen.1:3); ten times in Genesis 1
•To Abram: 'I will redeem your descendants from bondage' (paraphrase of Gen.15:13 – 15)
•To Abram and Sarai: 'You will have a son' (Gen.17:15 – 19)
•To Samuel: 'David will be king of Israel' (1 Sam.16:1 – 13)
•Etc. etc.



•Promise-Fulfillment: God speaks to act, and acts as He has spoken

 'Surely the LORD God will do nothing except that which He reveals to His servants the prophets.' (Amos 3:7)

- 'Prophets' are those to whom God speaks first
- God does not cause everything, only what He has spoken (and even then...)
- God gives people the opportunity to trust
