- To receive the doctor's health regimen
 - Humanity
 - Sick patients resisting treatment

THE WALL THE LEASE

- God
 - The doctor who must become the patient to perfect the cure in himself to become the donor
- Israel
 - God's medical focus group, to prepare for Jesus



- To receive the doctor's health regimen
 - Family medical history
 - The self
 - Originally good and is still: Genesis 1:26 28
 - Distinguish disease vs. self: Romans 7:14 25
 - The world
 - Is meant to be a garden
 - Spread the garden down the rivers: Genesis 2
 - The disease
 - Internalized the desire and power to define good and evil in a self-centered way: Genesis 3 – 4



 To receive the doctor's health regimen Receive as much health as you can Called back into a garden • "For this reason": Genesis 2:18 – 25 • "Her conjugal rights": Exodus 21:10 "Circumcise your hearts": Deuteronomy 10:16



- To receive the doctor's health regimen: participate in restoration of harm
 - Harm within one's own self
 - "Circumcise your hearts": Deuteronomy 10:16
 - Harm to others
 - "Until he is completely healed": Exodus 21:18 19
 - Harm to children's faith
 - While in exile, parents to children: Numbers 13 –
 14; Psalm 78
 - God willed exile, but not all harm: Zechariah 1:15;
 Isaiah 40:1 2; etc.



- To long for the cure
 - Circumcised heart
 - Deuteronomy 10:16; 30:6; Jeremiah 4:4; Romans 2:28
 29; 6:6; 8:3 4
 - Cleansed, new heart
 - Psalm 51:9 11; Ezekiel 11:18; 36:26 36; Matthew 19:3 12
 - God-scripted heart
 - Deuteronomy 6:4 9; Proverbs 3:3; 7:3; Jeremiah
 31:31 34; 2 Corinthians 3; Hebrews 8



- To long for the cure
 - No patient fully internalizes the health regimen
 - The doctor must become a patient
 - That patient must perfect the cure and become the donor
 - Isaiah 53, 59
 - Hebrews 1:1 3; 5:7 10; 8:1 9:28; 12:1 2
 - Matthew 3:13 4:11



- To rely on God's protection
 - Imagine a hospital
 - Imagine violence against the medical focus group







- To rely on God's protection
 - External opponents
 - Noah's generation: Genesis 5 9
 - Sodom and Gomorrah: Genesis 14, 19
 - Pharaoh in Egypt: Exodus 1 15
 - Canaanite military: Joshua 1 6, 8, 11
 - Internal opponents
 - Rejecting the doctor accelerates death: Exodus 32
 - Korah's rebellion: Numbers 16
 - Achan's war-profiteering: Joshua 7



- To rely on God's protection
 - Sheol/Hades like a coma ward
 - Temporary sedation in the hospital
 - Death and reappearance of Moses: Matthew 17
 - Death as interruption of desire-development
 - Jesus' "harrowing of hades": 1 Peter 3:18 20; 4:6

 - Why exile and mortality?
