



• The Spirit of God was hovering over the surface of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. (Genesis 1:2 – 3)






Holy Spirit in Luke: Background

The hand of the LORD was upon me, and He brought me out by the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley, and it was full of bones...He said to me, "Prophesy over these bones..." (Ezekiel 37:1ff.)

# Holy Spirit in Luke: Jesus

- Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. And she cried out with a loud voice... (Luke 1:41 – 42)
- Zacharias was filled with the Holy Spirit, and prophesied... (Luke 1:67)
- And Simeon came in the Spirit into the temple...and blessed God and said...(Luke 2:25 26)





### Holy Spirit in Luke: Jesus

- The Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove, and a voice came from heaven, "You are My beloved Son, in you I am well-pleased." (Luke 3:21)
- Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit...was led by the Spirit in the wilderness... Jesus answered Satan...Jesus answered him...Jesus answered him... (Luke 4:1 – 12)

### Holy Spirit in Luke: Jesus

- Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit...And he opened the book, and found the place where it was written, "The Spirit of the LORD is upon me to preach...to proclaim..." (Luke 4:14 18)
- And that very time he rejoiced greatly in the Holy Spirit and said... (Luke 10:21)
- And Jesus, crying out with a loud voice, said, "Father, into Thy hands I commit my Spirit." And having said this, he breathed his last. (Luke 23:25 26)



### Holy Spirit in Luke: Disciples

- The good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth what is good, and the evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth what is evil, for his mouth speaks from that which fills his heart. (Luke 6:45)
- One of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John also taught his disciples"... [Jesus replied] how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him? (Luke 11:1, 13)







## Holy Spirit in Luke: Disciples

- The Holy Spirit will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say. (Luke 12:10 12)
- Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written...that repentance for forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all the nations...you are to stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." (Luke 24:45 49)


You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you shall be my witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth." (Acts 1:7 – 8)




And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance... God says, "I will pour forth of My Spirit on all mankind, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy...I will in those days pour forth of My Spirit and they shall prophesy." (Acts 2:1 – 21)



- Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers and elders of the people..." (Acts 4:8)
- "O Lord, it is Thou...who by the Holy Spirit, through the mouth of our father David Thy servant, didst say...[Ps.2]" (Acts 4:24 25)
- They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak the word of God with boldness. (Acts 4:31)
- Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit...? Why is it that you have conceived this deed in your heart? You have not lied to men but to God. (Acts 5:1 5)



- But they were unable to cope with the wisdom and the Spirit with which [Stephen] was speaking. (Acts 6:10)
- But being full of the Holy Spirit...he said... (Acts 7:55 56)
- And the Spirit said to Philip...And Philip opened his mouth, and beginning from this Scripture he preached Jesus to him. (Acts 8:29 35)




"Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus...has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." And immediately...he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues saying, "He is the Son of God." (Acts 9:17 – 20)




While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who were listening to the message. And all the circumcised believers who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out upon the Gentiles also. For they were hearing them speaking with tongues and exalting God. (Acts 10:44-46



 And they sent Barnabus off to Antioch. Then when he had come and witnessed the grace of God, he rejoiced and began to encourage them all with resolute heart to remain true to the Lord, for he was a good man and full of the Holy Spirit and faith. (Acts 11:22 - 24)

## Encouragement: "The Work of a Critic" from *Ratatouille*


"In many ways, the work of a critic is easy. We risk very little, yet enjoy a position over those who offer up their work and themselves to our judgment. We thrive on negative criticism, which is fun to write and to read. But the bitter truth we critics must face is that, in the grand scheme of things, the average piece of junk is probably more meaningful than our criticism designating itself. But there are times when a critic truly risks something, and that is in the discovery and defense of the new. The world is often unkind to new talent, new creations. The new needs friends...




## Encouragement: "The Work of a Critic" from Ratatouille

"Last night I experienced something new: an extraordinary meal from a singularly unexpected source. To say that both the meal and its maker challenged my preconceptions about fine cooking is a gross understatement. They have rocked me to my core. In the past, I have made no secret of my disdain for chef Gusteau's famous motto, 'Anyone can cook.' But I realize, only now, do I truly understand what he meant. Not everyone can become a great artist. But a great artist can come from anywhere. It is difficult to imagine more humble origins than those of the genius now cooking at Gusteau's who is, in this critic's opinion, nothing less than the finest chef in France. I will be returning to Gusteau's soon, hungry for more."





- Now at this time some prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. And one of them named Agabus stood up and began to indicate by the Spirit that there would certainly be a great famine all over the world. And this took place in the reign of Claudius. (Acts 11:27 28)
- And while they were ministering to the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabus and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' (Acts 13:2)





• And the disciples were continually filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit. And it came about that in Iconium they entered the synagogue of the Jews together, and spoke in such a manner that a great multitude believed, both of Jews and of Greeks. (Acts 13:51 – 14:1)

They passed through the Phrygian and Galatian region, having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia...(Acts 16:6)






Now a certain Jew named Apollos, an Alexandrian by birth, an eloquent man, came to Ephesus, and he was mighty in the Scriptures... But when Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained to him the way of God more accurately...and when he had arrived...he powerfully refuted the Jews in public, demonstrating by the Scriptures that Jesus was the Christ. (Acts 18:24-28)




And it came about that while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper country came to Ephesus, and found some disciples...And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they began speaking with tongues and prophesying. (Acts 19:1-6)

For Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus... From Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called to him the elders of the church. And when they had come to him, he said to them ... 'And now, behold, bound by the Spirit, I am on my way to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there, except that the Holy Spirit solemnly testifies to me in every city, saying that bonds and afflictions await me...Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. (Acts 20:16-28)



After looking up the disciples, we stayed there seven days; and they kept telling Paul through the Spirit not to set foot in Jerusalem...As we were staying there for some days, a prophet named Agabus came down from Judea. And coming to us, he took Paul's belt and bound his own feet and hands, and said, 'This is what the Holy Spirit says: 'In this way the Jews at Jerusalem will bind the man who owns this belt and deliver him into the hands of the Gentiles." (Acts 21:4 – 11)

• Note also Ephesians 5:18 – 20: "And do not get drunk with wine, for that is dissipation, but be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord; always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God, even the Father."

#### Examples of Spirit-inspired speech:

- Praying and blessing (e.g. Elizabeth, Zacharias, Simeon)
- Praying and healing/exorcism (e.g. Jesus, disciples)
- Speaking in tongues (e.g. disciples at Pentecost)
- Proclaiming to a crowd (e.g. Peter, how the Old Testament has been fulfilled)
- Witnessing to Christ while under pressure (e.g. Stephen)
- Conversational evangelism and explaining Scripture (e.g. Philip)
- Encouraging and exhorting (e.g. Barnabus)
- Teaching and correcting others (e.g. Paul, Ephesian elders)
- Discernment (e.g. Paul correcting Elymas the magician)
- Predicting the future (e.g. Agabus)
